One of my mentors is Wendell Berry, a writer and farmer from Kentucky. Once, when asked what a person needs to do to live well, part of his response was, "Live three-dimensionally." What does that mean? As an AllPrep student, you have to spend a lot of time by yourself in front of a computer. Summer 2010—Study Abroad in Costa Rica!!!

Dear AllPrep Community Members,

You are invited to join AllPrep for our summer 2010 study abroad in Costa Rica. Costa Rica is a safe country with endless learning opportunities in the arts and sciences. We are partnering with EF Tours to ensure that both learning and safety are top priorities.

Enrollment has been extended through November 30th. Currently, thirteen participants are enrolled and there is room for more travelers. Teacher Jennifer DiMaggio will accompany me as a co-leader and chaperone for the entire tour.



The current fee for students is \$2,056 and is all-inclusive (airfare, hotels, meals, curriculum, guides and teachers, entrance fees, boat and bus transportation, etc.) The only things that are not included are the 2 meals during flight, tips, and spending money for souvenirs. Passports will also need to be purchased. The adult fee is \$2,361 due to higher entrance and hotel fees. These prices are the lowest you will find for such a high quality study abroad.

Travel dates will be 8-11 days that fall between July 29 and August 16, 2010. I would like to provide you as much information as possible about this experience of a lifetime. You will find the links at the end of this message very helpful.

By participating in this study abroad, students will earn 1.0 elective science credit with the bonus of Spanish conversation practice, immense learning, and rich life experience. EF Tours has a great reputation and has been used repeatedly with great success by several of my colleagues and students.

This opportunity is open to Allprep & Early College middle and high school students (including this year's 5th graders), and any interested family members or friends over the age of 6 (children under the age of 13 should travel with a parent or guardian). It is possible for relatives or friends to depart from other locations than Portland.

Fundraising will be organized by all involved parties; there will be numerous opportunities. I have Chinook Books available for those that would like to use them in fundraising. Other fundraising options will be presented.
